How to mend a Puncture

Material needed :

A bowl of water, rubber gum, patch, pump, cloth, sand paper

Steps:

1. First, locate the cause of the puncture – e.g. nail Then open up the valve to let air out of inner tub.
2. Next, take outer tire off.
3. Remove the inner tube.
4. After that, pump the tube and put it in a bowl of water. Move the tube slowly under water. Air bubbles indicate position of punctured area.
5. Take the tube out of water and rub the punctured area. Dry with cloth. Clean it with sand paper.
6. Spread rubbergum over the punctured area and place a patch over the punctured area. Press down hard and let it dry. Pump up the tube again. Check that air does not escape from patched area. Let air out.

7. Put the tube back into the tire.
 8. Finally put tire back on the rim. Pump up the tube.
 9. Now the bicycle is ready for riding.
